What is end-of-life care and palliative care?

The terms 'end-of-life care' and 'palliative care' are often used interchangeably in Australia. They are defined by the same approach to care.

caring@home uses the term end-of-life care to refer to the last 12 months of life.

Palliative care:

- is not time limited and is provided for a person with an active progressive advanced disease who has little or no prospect of cure
- is person and family-centred
- aims to optimise quality of life; as expressed by the person.


FOR CLINICAL SERVICES	
Example policy and procedures	Enables services to develop and/or review relevant documentation within their own policy and procedures framework.
NEW National Core Community Palliative Care Medicines List	Identifies four medicines for use by home-based, terminal-phase patients who require urgent symptom relief. The National List facilitates timely, easy access to medicines in the community.
Guidelines for the handling of palliative care medicines in community services	Informs the development of protocols and procedures by services about handling medicines in the community.

FOR HEALTH PROFESSIONALS	
NEW Prompts for End-of-Life Planning (PELP) Framework	Guides proactive, quality end-of-life care across all care settings.
NEW Audit tool: End-of-Life Planning	Supports quality improvement in caring for patients likely to be in their last year of life.
NEW Community Palliative Care Resources Pharmacy Pack	Contains resources to help pharmacists support families and carers in providing practical care, physical symptom management and subcutaneous medicine management for a person at home.
Online education modules and education PowerPoints	Informs health professionals how caring@home resources can support carers to help manage symptoms in the community.
palliMEDS app	Provides prescribing advice about <u>commonly-used palliative care medicines</u> , including those from the National Core Community Palliative Care Medicines List, for managing terminal symptoms frequently experienced by home-based patients.
caring@home and caring@home First Nations apps	Provides easy, quick access to caring@home resources.
Managing palliative care symptoms: A guide for health professionals	Assists health professionals to support First Nations families caring for a person who chooses to be cared for and pass at home, if possible.
