Why is an infusion pump used?

An infusion pump is a way to give medicine to help manage symptoms such as pain.

- 🚺 Safe
- ✓ No needles
- ✓ Medicine goes under the skin
- Medicine is pumped throughout the day and night
- ✓ Keeps the person comfortable
- Good when medicine cannot be swallowed
- Good when medicine cannot be absorbed well in the gut

These things help to keep the person comfortable.



How does the pump work?



Uses a battery
Medicine is put in a cassette
Medicine is pumped from the cassette through tubing
Medicine goes into a plastic tube under the person's skin.
The place where the plastic tube enters the skin is called the insertion site.

Ways to help look after the pump

Check the insertion site a few times a day

- Contact your nurse if you notice:
 - Lump/swelling
 - Soreness
 - Bruising/redness
- The plastic tube has come out of the skin
- coming off
- Leakage around the insertion site
- The clear dressing is



Check the pump a few times a day 2

You do not need to check the pump overnight.

It is good if the green light on the pump is flashing.



It is not good if the pump is flashing and alarming.





Remember



A bag can be used to carry the pump.



The pump is not waterproof.
